Today's newsletter is the last before our students finish up for the 2012 school year and I would like to take this opportunity to congratulate each of them on their efforts this year and, in particular, with the generally mature and conscientious approach that has been evident in recent weeks as end of semester assessment tasks are due and end of year examinations begin.

Conveyance Allowance

Yesterday, I had great pleasure and some relief in announcing that the State Minister for Education had announced in Parliament a reversal of the State Government's decision on Conveyance Allowance with respect to means testing. The decision on metropolitan Melbourne's urban borders will remain but the critical aspect for us - means testing has been removed. This decision removes the threat of most Mercy families becoming liable for the cost of Conveyance Allowance in future years.

This is a big win for country independent schools and for Mercy in particular. I would like to take this opportunity to thank all parents, families and members of the broader Mercy community for your support on this issue. I would also like to acknowledge and thank the local State MLA, Mr. Terry Mulder, the local State MLC, Mr. Simon Ramsay and the local Federal MP, Mr. Dan Tehan for their support and lobbying on our behalf.

End of Year Thanksgiving Mass and Awards

A warm invitation is extended to all members of the Mercy Regional College community – students, staff and parents – to join us at the College's End of Year Thanksgiving Mass at St Thomas', Terang on Monday 10th December starting at 7.00 pm. Mass will be followed by the presentation of year level academic and special awards and then supper in the St Thomas' parish hall. This mass and awards celebration will culminate what has been another fantastic year for Mercy Regional College and I would love to see as many people in attendance as possible.

2013 Mercy Regional College Musical Production

iPads@MRC

Next year, the College will continue its two year rollout of iPads to all Year 7 – 10 students with 2013 students in Years 7 and 9 receiving iPads. An information evening to explain this process was held at McAuley Campus on Wednesday night with 60-70 students and parents in attendance. A letter and information sheet has been emailed or sent home to all parents of these students explaining the process and asking them to indicate to the school whether they intend to purchase the device themselves outright or wish to use the College's purchase plan over the next two years. I ask all 2013 Year 7 and 9 parents to ensure that this indication is returned on the sheet provided by next **Friday 7th December.**

Wednesday's information evening also provided the opportunity for parents concerned with the problems some adolescent children have in managing the internet and social media to discuss these issues with the College. We have identified this issue as a major focus for parent information nights and student education in 2013.

Alcohol and your child:

Harm minimisation:

As parents, family or community members we can help to increase the safe use of alcohol by young people.

Some tips for parents.

- Talk to your children about what is important to them and their plans in life.
- Know who your child's friends and parents are.
- Start discussions about alcohol and drugs and the effect on young bodies.
- Know where your child is..... it is OK to insist on this as a safety measure.
- Talk about ways of getting home safely from parties and other places where alcohol may be used (walking late at night is not a good option). Do this BEFORE your child leaves for the occasion.
- Provide money for a taxi.
- Plan for your child to stay at a friend's place and follow this up with a phone call to the parents.
- Harm minimisation is as much about preventing anticipated harm as reducing actual harm.
- Party planning...talk with other parents about providing a safe environment at a party. Alcohol is not the be all and end all for a good party.
- If you are planning a party, talk to other parents who have hosted one. Their experience can help a lot when you are planning a party.
- Encourage car-pooling to parties and other events. This not only shares the work load but is supportive of other parents and families. It also helps you to keep in contact with people your child may mix with.

Parties / Alcohol and the Law:

Regarding unlicensed parties, there is some risk of legal liability attached to the provision of alcohol to party guests and in particular those under the age of 18 years.

Teenage parties are a dilemma for parents. We want our children to have fun and learn social skills, but no one wants drunken behaviour, property damage, personal injury and gate-crashers to be the outcome of such a party. Yet young people often want to have alcohol available.

The next day we travelling to the Northern Grampians to complete a 12km walk at Mount Stapylton. It was also a challenging walk and after approximately five hours we were finished. The view from the top of Mount Stapylton was worth all the effort. Our final day involved a 2-hour mountain bike ride around Halls Gap and then it was time to travel home.

All students did a great job completing all the activities and should be happy with their efforts.



OUR BUDDING AVIATOR

Hey, my name is Chris Barks. You may have heard that I am a pilot. Yes I am! I am in Year 9 and 16 years of age. It is true - surprisingly - that you can actually hold an aircraft operators certificate (License) at the young age of 15 (even before you can start learning how to drive a car). The only requirements to fly solo are: must be aged 15 years or older, medically fit to hold an Australian Car drivers license and be able to speak English. It is these three things that allow you to fly alone (without an instructor).

I did my first lesson two years ago in Evektor Sportstar (24-4010), a small Light Sport Aircraft (LSA) that was able to carry two people at once. Since then, I have been doing lessons involving stalls, forced landings, takeoff/landing etc. up until the time I got my license.

I managed to receive my RA-Aus Recreational Pilots Certificate (Restricted) on 16th October, 2012 at Warrnambool Regional Airport. Since then, I have flown my parents, grandparents and myself around my training area. This is why it is a restricted license, as I am restricted to the airspace that I am able to fly in. This airspace extends from Warrnambool, to Peterborough, up to Terang, across to Mortlake, then west along the powerline to the smelter in Portland, then from Orford, back down to Yambuk, then back along the coast to Warrnambool. Now I'm working hard for my "cross-country endorsement" (so that I can go out of the training area).

On Thursday, 15th November I was interviewed by a reporter from WIN TV about my success. The interview was broadcast during WIN News at 6:30 pm the following week.

At first, I did not know that I could start at such an early age. Just research, talking and having contacts with pilots in the major airlines (including Virgin Australia and Sharp Airlines) also helped me lots. My advice to people who want to follow a dream career is to talk to people involved in the industry. Keep in contact with them so that you can ask them questions - and not only that - have lists of questions e.g. how did you get to your current profession? Do lots of research!

I hope you found my story inspiring and helpful to you.

EXPRESSION OF INTEREST
FRANCE AND BELGIUM 2013

The College is looking for expressions of interest from students to participate in a trip to France, Belgium and England in 2013.

The opportunity is offered to all students from Years 9-12, who will be enrolled at Mercy Regional College in 2013. The trip is strictly optional and will take place in the last week of Term 3 and the first week of the September / October 2013 school holidays. I anticipate the trip will be for approximately 15 days.

The trip will focus on the experience of the Australians on the Western Front in the First World War. The group will visit Paris, the Somme region where Australians fought in the great and terrible battles of 1916 and in the campaigns of 1918. We will then travel to the Flanders region and the Ypres battlefields of Belgium, stopping on the way to visit the village of Fromelles where Australia's tragic first major battle in France was fought in July 1916. From Belgium we will travel to London where we will visit some of the sites of that great city as well as other places of interest in England's south.

Early notice is being given to provide sufficient time for parents to budget and plan and in particular for students to save money and contribute towards the cost of the trip themselves. A meeting will be held early in first term of 2013 for all who have expressed interest. Those who wish to book a place on the tour will be required to pay a deposit of \$500.00. Further instalments may be made throughout next year with final numbers to be confirmed by June 2013.

At this stage all that is needed, is for you to indicate willingness for your son / daughter to participate in the trip by filling in the section below and returning it to the college office by **Friday 7th December 2012**.
