This year, I have been privileged to enjoy two extended periods of leave, both of which have been enriching. Class of 2016

Next Wednesday 19th October sees the completion of thirteen years of education for Mercy Regional College's class of 2016. The day is always both exciting and emotional. As has been the case in recent years, it will include a mix of homeroom and Year 12 time as well as the annual Mercy's Got Talent competition and the Year 12 Final Assembly. Parents, family members and friends are warmly invited to join us for the afternoon's assembly that is always a highlight of the day. It will begin at 1.30pm in the de Chantal Stadium. As part of this, O'Keeffe students will be bussed across to Camperdown at recess and will depart from McAuley Campus at the end of the day.

Although the next few days are a very exciting time for our Year 12 students, it is also important for them to remember that their VCE exams are just around the corner and that any celebrations marking the end of formal schooling must be balanced by the need to effectively use the seven days of study available before the English exam. Year 12 students are also reminded that they need to maintain the excellent standards of behavior that have been demonstrated throughout this year and that any instances of disrespect to students, staff or school property will be regarded most seriously. **Participation in next month's Year 12 Graduation is contingent on finishing Year 12 in the manner expected of all Mercy Regional College students.**

Buildings Update

Progress has continued at a pleasing rate on our Stage 2 buildings with our builders, Fairbrother Constructions, indicating that they expect to complete work by the end of this month (around 4 weeks ahead of schedule). We are currently waiting on some carpet which is the only issue that may delay this. With this exciting news, we hope to be able to move our current Year 10 classes into the new building next month. At this stage, Year 9 classes will stay as is.

Many in our community that St Patrick's Primary School are about to undertake some renovations in and around the old McAuley canteen site. As a result of these works, the 'laneway' between the two schools will be closed and we will be moving some Year 11 classes into the Year 12 area later next week.

Mercy Regional College Bus Passes

Last term following consultation with those staff responsible, I distributed a letter which prohibited the issuing of bus passes in most circumstances including for sports training, music and dance lessons and any social events. This decision reflected an increase in the number of students and families who were not following or completely ignoring the guidelines for the issuing of bus passes.

After speaking with a number of parents, I am currently reviewing this decision and giving consideration to reopening access to bus passes on a limited number of Mercy Regional College contract buses. In particular, we are examining the contract buses that connect the three centres of Camperdown, Terang and Noorat. If this decision is taken, new procedures will govern the issuing of passes with no exceptions possible.

Upcoming Staff PD Day and the Melbourne Cup weekend

Could all parents and families take note of the following dates:

- Next **Thursday 20th November**, all Mercy teaching staff will be involved in a professional development day. There will no classes operating. During the day, teaching staff will work individually and in teams with a focus on the new Oxford ebooks to be introduced in 2017.
- Similar to previous years, the College will be closed on **Monday 31st October and Tuesday 1st November** for a Board holiday and the Melbourne Cup.

It has been a particularly busy opening to fourth term for students and staff with plenty to happen in the next couple of weeks, some of these activities include:

We look forward to donating a significant cheque to the Camperdown Hospital Auxiliary.
2. Last week, Melbourne hosted the Year 9 camp with students undertaking a variety of activities in and around the CBD. Congratulations to all students as your behaviour and enthusiasm was exemplary with staff involved commenting on how enjoyable the three days were.
3. Good luck to those students and staff who departed this morning for the second Kimberley immersion trip, we hope that all the planning and preparation is worth it and look forward to your return. It was with equal measures of envy and excitement that I read the itinerary and reflected on these sites that my family and I visited in April and May.
4. Congratulations to Luke Francis (8A) on being awarded the Under 16 Encouragement Trophy at the Warrnambool & District Soccer League's Best & Fairest Presentations on Friday night. The award recognises a player with high potential who the league wants to encourage to continue their development.

Do you still study art at school?

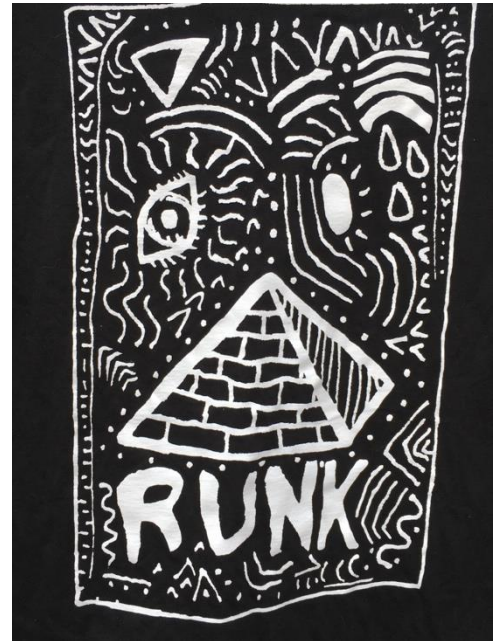

Red Frogs Day

Mark Gellie from the 'Red Frogs Crew' visited MRC this Tuesday to speak to Year 12's about their program, before they complete their studies, and head off to Australia's biggest party for 17-18 Yr. old -Schoolies (either locally, interstate or overseas), 'O' Week at University, and music festivals. It also provides support to uni students, party and festival goers, event managers sporting groups, and musicians in Australia, New Zealand, UK, Canada, South Africa, and Poland.

Red Frogs started in 1997, and is a support program for young people from the ages 15-25. They recognize that the culture of young people is dominated by alcohol, and that the excessive consumption of alcohol and other substances can lead to dangerous and life altering behaviours. Therefore, Red Frogs make it their mission to provide a positive peer presence in alcohol-fuelled environments where young people gather, educate young people on safe partying behaviours, and promote and provide non-alcoholic and/or diversionary activities that engage young people in these environments – ie; cooking pancakes, hydration stations, icy-poles etc.

Mark emphasized in his speech how important it was to look out for your mates, and to stick together, drink lots of water and eat food, and avoid dark quiet areas when out and about in a foreign place.

The Red Frogs Crew who first got the name by using the lolly as 'icebreakers' when first arriving at parties – are sponsored by Allen's confectionary and have become so popular that they go through over 15 tonnes of red frog lollies annually!

MERCY REGIONAL COLLEGE FRANCE AND BELGIUM BATTLEFIELDS TOUR 2017

The Mercy Regional College France and Belgium Battlefields Tour 2017 will begin with three nights in Paris. We will arrive in the famous City of Lights early in the morning and we will have an introductory tour of the city. We will see the ancient sights including Notre Dame de Paris made famous in Victor Hugo's Nineteenth Century book The Hunchback of Notre Dame. We will see the Place de la Concorde where many so called enemies of the State were executed during the French Revolution and we will visit one of the great streets of the world, the Avenue des Champs-Élysées.



After arriving at our hotel we will walk the famous streets of this wonderful city to a restaurant where we will have a welcome to Paris dinner. Over the next few days we will visit all the famous places in Paris. We will take the bus out to Louis XIV's magnificent Palace at Versailles. Here we will see the opulence in which the Royalty of

France lived from the end of the 17th Century until the Revolution of 1789. We will also visit and climb that great structure constructed for the Paris Exposition of 1889 the Eiffel Tower. The views of Paris from the Tower are magnificent and show the contours of the medieval city which was largely rebuilt between 1830 and 1900.

We will also wander the ancient winding streets and alleys of Montmartre leading up to the church of Sacre Couer which overlooks the city. This area is famous for the artists who inhabited the area until recent years. Our tour will also take us to the Louvre where 35,000 objects from



prehistory to the 21st century are exhibited; among the most famous, of course, Leonardo da Vinci's Mona Lisa.



Paris is a grand city which should be visited at least once in a lifetime; those Australians who served in France and Belgium during the First World War might well have had the chance to do so. Our tour then, begins by experiencing the culture, art and life of one of the world's great cities.
