The start of this newsletter reflects my recent trip with Mercy students and staff to the Battlefields of the First World War in France and Belgium. As a prayer, I return to the famous poem, "In Flanders Fields" written by Canadian doctor, Lieutenant-Colonel John McCrae in May 1915. The poem itself was written in memory of a close friend of McCrae's who was killed in the second battle of Ypres.

In Flanders Fields

*In Flanders fields the poppies grow
Between the crosses, row on row,
That mark our place; and in the sky
The larks, still bravely singing, fly
Scarce heard amid the guns below.*

*We are the Dead. Short days ago
We lived, felt dawn, saw sunset glow,
Loved and were loved, and now we lie
In Flanders fields.*

*Take up our quarrel with the foe:
To you from failing hands we throw
The torch; be yours to hold it high.
If ye break faith with us who die
We shall not sleep, though poppies grow
In Flanders fields.*



This sombre poem captures both the indomitable human spirit that remains across the fields and low rolling hills of the Western Front as well as the desolation of a place that saw the pointless loss of countless young lives. One hundred years after the Great War, these sites remain significant sites of pilgrimage for young and older people alike; they are visited by visitors from Europe, North America and from the other side of the globe, Australia and New Zealand. Hundreds of thousands of graves (named and unnamed) dot the landscape, impeccably maintained by the Commonwealth War Graves Commission with each cemetery, large and small, identical in their formality and simplicity.

Our Battlefields trip was bookended by time in two of the world's great cities, Paris and London, yet the highlights of the two weeks away were the visits to dozens of Commonwealth cemeteries where our students paid homage to relatives and family friends who had served and often perished in these fields.

A sincere thank you to the students and staff who shared this time away but especially to Mr. Lachie Lee whose inspiration, knowledge and leadership made the trip so memorable.

WCB ADRIAN MEADE DAIRY INNOVATION PROGRAM

During the school holidays, Year 10 students Hannah Whytcross and Max Bond took part in Warrnambool Cheese and Butter's five-day Adrian Meade Dairy Innovation Program, along with four other students selected by interview from around WCB's milk supply region.

This program shows students the many interesting careers available across the entire dairy industry supply chain and training pathways into these careers.

The program started on Monday 2 October at WCB's Allansford factory looking at milk processing, the product range, quality assurance, transport and logistics processes. This was followed by a four-day tour of the supply chain, visiting six WCB supplier farms, the Ridley feed mill at Terang, Dairy Australia in Melbourne, visits with WCB's retail and international sales staff, and seeing export processes in action at the Port of Melbourne.

The program also visited Deakin University in Warrnambool to look at the upcoming Food and Agribusiness major in the commerce degree, Federation University in Ballarat to look at Food Technology courses, and University of Melbourne to look at pathways into agriculture and veterinary courses.

On the final afternoon of the program, students presented to parents and WCB management and staff about their experience on the program, and were presented with certificates by General Manager, Milk Supply, Anthony Cook.

Hannah was keen to take part to see the different careers that dairy farming provides. She particularly enjoyed meeting members of a family farm near Ballarat who are passionate about their crops and pastures, and preparing and showing dairy cattle. Hannah has plans to be a Jillaroo for couple of years and then to either milk for her parents or buy her own farm to run dairy or beef. She plans to complete Certificate III and IV and a Diploma of Agriculture.

‘The best part of this program is meeting like-minded kids my own age who have a passion for farming’, Hannah says.

Max was also very interested to see the different careers the dairy industry provides. ‘The best part about this program was seeing how other farms operate’, he says. Like Hannah, Max also plans to complete Certificate III and IV and a Diploma of Agriculture.

Battlefields Report

Mr. Lachie Lee

The 2017 France and Belgium Battlefields Tour was held over two weeks from 15th September. Our touring party of thirty-five students and adults visited the World War One battlefields of the Somme in France and Ypres in Belgium. We visited the sites and memorials that are significant to the Australian experience of the First World War. Nearly fifty thousand Australians died on the Western Front of the Great War from 1916 until November 1918. The presence of these Australians is still very real and our group saw much evidence of how well their efforts are regarded.

Importantly, our group made very real connections with our forebears through research projects of family members or members of the community who served or died in the First World War. We visited cemeteries where these people are buried or the memorials where they are remembered if they have no known grave. In some cases, we were the first family or friends to visit these graves and the pilgrimages were quite emotional at times. Some of these sites are in quiet, out of the way spots and are peaceful, beautiful places. We also visited the sites of the terrible costly battles in which the Australians fought, some of them disasters and some triumphs. This tour certainly opens our eyes to the great, enduring sacrifices of war.

I'd like to congratulate and thank the members of our 2017 tour group whose whole-hearted engagement with the project made it so successful. As a group, we investigated forty soldiers and nurses who served in the Great War. Their story is ours and it helps us to make a very real connection with the lives of those who came before us.

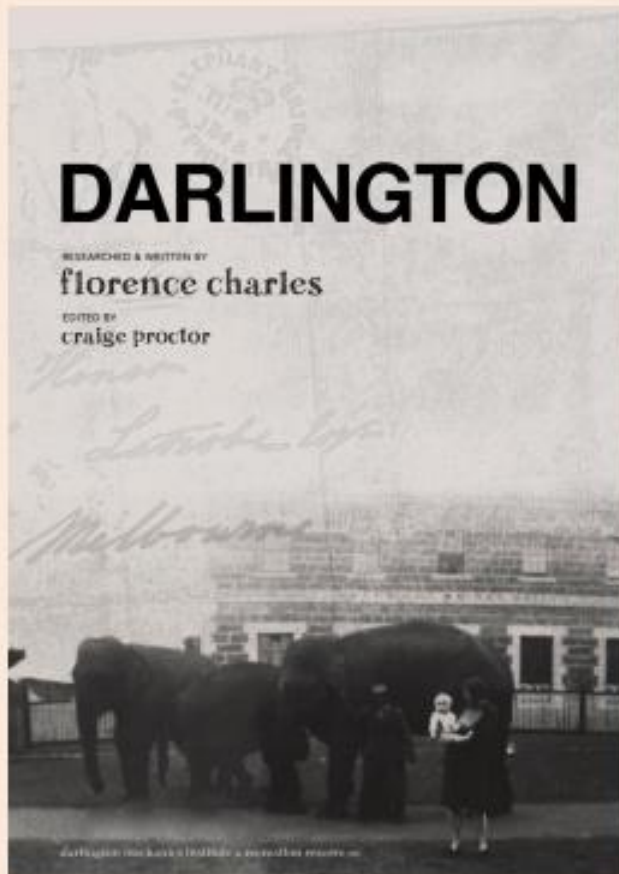
