End of Year Thanksgiving Mass

This change reflected our desire to enable all students (Year 7 – 11) to be a part of the celebration as well as giving those parents and family members who can join us the opportunity to do so. With all students travelling to Terang in the middle of day, some special arrangements will be in place for students as follows:

- Following Mass and Awards, most students will then be bussed back to catch their normal buses home. However, students will be able to be dismissed from the church afterwards if parent contact has been made with College Reception prior OR parents are in attendance and HR teachers are notified.
- We are still investigating provision for Terang based students wishing to stay ahead of catching their bus connections and will communicate these arrangements ahead of the day.

2018 MacBook Program

A reminder about some of the changes that have been implemented for the College's MacBook program in 2018, these changes affect students moving into Year 7 and Year 9 next year.

- The major change is that students at Year 7 & 8 (starting with next year's Year 7 students) will be leasing their MacBook from the College over two years rather than purchasing a new device outright for three years. This decision was taken to lower the costs on families both for Year 7 & 8 but more substantially over a child's six years at Mercy.
- Students commencing Year 10 in 2019, will purchase their MacBook under arrangements similar to those used in the last two years.
- From 2020, Year 9 students will purchase their MacBook under Apple's new four year guarantee which will mean the purchase of only one device across the six years of schooling at Mercy.

- 2018 Unit 1&2 students will complete transition classes in the week beginning Monday 4th December.
- Current Year 8 students will spend a day at the McAuley Campus on Tuesday 28th November ahead of their move to Camperdown next year.
- Prospective 2018 Year 7 students will complete their second transition day at the O'Keeffe Campus on Tuesday 28th November.

As part of these arrangements and to allow the Year 7 2018 Transition Program to work as well as possible, **all current Year 7 students will not have classes next Tuesday 28th November.**

BOOKLIST INFORMATION

Mr. Chris Grant – Deputy Principal

There may be some misunderstanding surrounding the current booklists for students going into 2018. Apologies for this. Please see clarification below.

Oxford resources

We are now into our second year utilising the Oxford resources for students in Years 7-10, for English, Mathematics, Science and Humanities. There are two options on the booklist when purchasing Oxford resources. New, for Year 7 (\$195, including Atlas & Dictionary) and 8-10 (\$150). Or, textbooks can be purchased second hand. The codes can be reactivated free of charge for the life of the edition (until it moves to a new edition or goes out of print), so there is no need to purchase reactivation codes for these textbooks.

If students in Year's 7-10 for 2018 are purchasing Oxford textbooks second hand, then they must still purchase the Atlas and Dictionary (if not retained from previous year) and English workbook as listed on the booklist.

Edrolo VCE resources

Edrolo resources for VCE subjects (those listed on individual booklists) are a compulsory resource and must be purchased through the booklist.

This is identified on the booklist as an Edrolo levy for a particular subject, \$27.50.

An excerpt out of an email sent to Year 10-12 students can be seen below.

Edrolo is an online resource dedicated to supporting you throughout your VCE. <https://edrolo.com.au/vic-student-intro/> (watch introductory clip). Edrolo can be used in a variety of ways throughout the coming year, by your teachers, and in your own study and revision of the material covered in class. It is also great for catching up on things you might have missed while absent. As with any study tool or resource at your disposal, it's up to you to make the most of what you have access to.

Edrolo levies do not apply to all VCE subjects.

SENIOR SCHOOL REPORT

The 2017 Year 12 students graduated last Thursday night bringing to a close their studies at Mercy Regional College. The graduation is a celebration of achievement and there is a real sense of joy, relief and excitement for the future. Some of the cohort have already begun work, others have taken up summer jobs and are preparing themselves for tertiary education and many of them are setting off on well-earned holidays.

The external exam process worked well for most students allowing them the opportunity to test themselves against all others in the state. Now we await the ATAR scores. Year 12 is not all about exams, however, as satisfactory attainment of the VCE and VCAL are about achieving the tasks, not exam results. This achievement for some students is actually a major effort and something of which to be very proud.

At the moment, Year 11 students are working through the Start Up program where they begin their Year 12 classes for 2018. These classes are very important as students are introduced to content and assessments for their Unit 3 subjects. This material will not be repeated in the new school year. Students and teachers have found the classes to be quite exciting as new ideas and challenges are introduced. Our Start Up program covers an entire timetable cycle of nine periods so they are a great opportunity to jump into the fundamentals of each subject. The Start Up program also allows students the opportunity to review their choices and, if possible, change subjects.

The Year 11 exam period was quite successful as well. These exams are conducted in a quite formal environment and act as a guide to students' progress. It is important to remember that our exams do assess passing or failure of a subject. Satisfactory completion of a subject is determined in accordance with VCAA guidelines, whereby a student is required to demonstrate competence and knowledge of a topic. This is demonstrated through a variety of tasks as set by the school.

Unit 1 2018 Transition occurs in the last week of school. There will be transition classes up until the last day of school, Friday 8th December and, again, it is very important that students attend all of these classes.
