FROM THE PRINCIPAL

Across Australia this week, we celebrate Refugee Week and recognise the enormous contributions that refugees, asylum seekers and immigrants more broadly have given to our nation. As the proud child of a Dutch immigrant family, I understand the incredible courage that it takes to leave one's family, village and culture to seek a better and safer life. We should also remember that Jesus was himself a refugee and asylum seeker, forced to flee to Egypt to avoid King Herod's pogrom on Jewish first-born boys as described in the Gospel of Matthew.

One of the most regrettable movements in recent years has been the demonization of refugees and asylum seekers across the Western world; and especially here in Australia, in the US and across Europe. Those seeking safety for themselves and their children are forced to spend years and decades in vast, inhuman camps in the border regions of countries least able to accommodate them.

My prayer today is one that remembers those seeking asylum and refugee status:

*Lord God, no one is a stranger to you and no one is ever far from your loving care.
In your kindness, watch over refugees and victims of war,
those separated from their loved ones, young people who are lost,
and those who have left home or who have run away from home.
Bring them back safely to the place where they belong to and help us always
to show your kindness to strangers and to all in need.
Grant this through Christ our Lord.
Amen*

2019 Enrolment Planning

With the start of third term almost here, planning for next year is underway and given the size of Mercy, forward planning needs to be comprehensive, considered and completed in a timely fashion.

2019 enrolment applications are due this **Friday 29th June** into the College with a \$100 deposit. Early next term, on Monday 30th and Tuesday 31st July the second stage in the College enrolment processes occurs for incoming 2018 Year 7 students with enrolment interviews to be held at McAuley Campus (Monday evening) and O'Keeffe Campus (Tuesday evening) from 3.30 – 6.00pm.

These enrolment interviews provide both the College and prospective students and parents to meet, discuss transition arrangements, identify and discuss any areas of concern and provide an invaluable opportunity for prospective students to reflect on what the transition to secondary education might entail. Letter from Bishop Paul Bird

Attached to this newsletter is a copy of a letter from Bishop Paul Bird below about how our diocese is responding to the Royal Commission recommendations. Early in Term 3, the Catholic Education Office Ballarat will provide guidelines around how Catholic education in our diocese might contribute to a whole of community response to the Royal Commission recommendations.

Responding to the Royal Commission

Last December the Royal Commission into Institutional Responses to Child Sexual Abuse issued its final report. As we know, the recommendations of the Commission were made after careful consideration following an inquiry that spanned five years. The recommendations that relate either generally or specifically to the Catholic Church require an active response from our Catholic community throughout Australia and from our diocese of Ballarat.

One of the key actions for us as a diocese will be to sign up to the Commonwealth Redress Scheme, which is due to come into effect on July 1. An independent, national redress scheme for survivors of child sexual abuse was one of the main recommendations of the Royal Commission. It is also an initiative endorsed by survivors, their families and advocates. The Catholic Church has long supported such a scheme. Now that the scheme is becoming a reality, we are able to join.

It is vital that survivors of institutional sexual abuse have fair and consistent access to financial redress, counselling as needed, and, if they wish, a personal apology for the abuse they have suffered. The Commonwealth redress scheme will provide these elements.

Following the Royal Commission Report, the Australian Catholic Bishops Conference and Catholic Religious Australia have set up two groups to take forward the Commission's recommendations.

Catholic Professional Standards is an independent company, with a board of directors comprised of lay men and women. Its role includes establishing national safeguarding standards that provide a framework for all Catholic entities to build child-safe cultures. In addition, this company will monitor how dioceses and religious orders are complying with the standards in practice.

There is also an Implementation Advisory Group, which will advise Catholic entities about implementing the whole range of Commission recommendations, such as those referring to ongoing care for survivors, improved forms of governance of parishes and schools, and the training of Church personnel.

In the diocese of Ballarat, a range of measures is already in place to ensure the safety of children and the ongoing support of survivors of abuse. These include:

- the review, improvement and implementation of child protection policies and procedures across parishes, schools and Catholic agencies;
- the appointment of a diocesan professional standards coordinator;
- the appointment of safeguarding officers for all parishes, schools and agencies;
- the review of past settlements with survivors to ensure the settlements are fair;
- developing a more professional and holistic approach to supporting survivors;
- implementing a school curriculum that seeks to empower children and young people to have a voice in their education and to enhance their personal safety.

The next stage of responding to the findings of the Royal Commission for the diocese of Ballarat will include:

- participation as a diocesan community in an audit by Catholic Professional Standards of how we are implementing the safeguarding standards they have established. This audit is likely to be held before the end of 2018.
- engagement with local survivors and their health professionals, seeking their feedback on how we are responding to the Royal Commission Report recommendations;
- trialling of a new approach to the governance of parish schools;
- continuing to explore ways in which we can provide pastoral and practical assistance to survivors and their families.

While no one can undo past wrongs, we have an opportunity as a Church to demonstrate that we are attentive to the recommendations of the Royal Commission and that we will hold ourselves accountable to the high standards expected by the broader community.

In presenting the final report, the Chair of the Commission said, “the sexual abuse of any child is intolerable in a civilised society” and “we must each resolve that we should do what we can to protect them.”

May Christ guide us in our efforts to assist those who have suffered and in the care we provide for children today.

Reports Update

This semester reports will not be printed, and can be accessed via Parent Access Module (PAM). If you have trouble accessing PAM please contact reception for assistance. Paper copies of reports will be provided on request.

The main aim of assessment is to provide evidence of learning and student progress. Teachers use a range of methods to track progress, target teach and improve learning outcomes for students. Good assessment allows for opportunities to practise skills, identify potential learning obstacles and strengths, and move forward. Teachers aim to provide regular feedback to students. Students are then encouraged to reflect on how well they met task criteria (or standard, goal, learning intention, etc.). Teachers and students will work together on strategies for improvement.

Reporting on student achievement and progress at Mercy occurs in a variety of ways:

- Parent/student/teacher interviews (twice a year)
- Interim reports each semester
- Summary semester reports
- Ongoing reporting via PAM
- Other communication, such as phone calls and emails

This semester, reports will include a description of the subject/unit, outcomes and progression (Years 7-10), as well as work practices for learning, self-management and social interaction. Reports will no longer include a paragraph on future learning. Teachers now report on assessment and future learning online, in an ongoing manner. You are encouraged to view these comments regularly, and discuss them with your child.

During the process of transition to this new reporting style, there will be a mix of assessment results for VCE subjects, including letter grades and raw scores. The focus should be on the comments and feedback, rather than the grade.

Regardless of what year level your child is in, assessment provides information about being 'at standard'. This is standard is measured at 'Proficient' for Years 7-10 and around a 'C' or 'Medium' at VCE. Again, the real conversations should be about effort and progress.

We always welcome conversations regarding your child's progress.

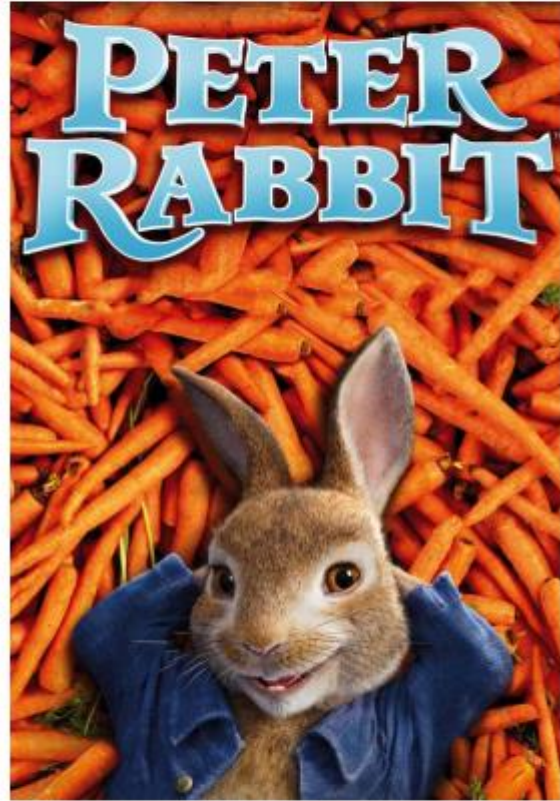
